PRESIDENT'S LETTER



The Dallas Center-Grimes Education
Foundation (DCGEF) is an organization
made up of dedicated volunteers who work
together to fulfill the mission of supporting
DCG students in their pursuit of higher
education through financial scholarships
generated in partnership with community
philanthropic and fundraising initiatives.
This annual report demonstrates the growth
of DCGEF as well as the commitment of our
communities to support the education of
our youth.

DCGEF was established in 2014 by a group of visionary community members who saw the power in creating a foundation primarily to support continuing education for DCG graduates and secondarily provide supplemental curricular materials and equipment for PK-12 classrooms.

We are very fortunate to be a part of the Dallas Center and Grimes communities! DCGEF started with approximately \$1.3 million with the dissolution of the Burnett family trust. At the end of the calendar year, our assets total \$1,378,113.95. In 2022, we awarded a total of \$157,650 to graduating seniors from the DCG Community School District. The continued increase in assets and scholarships funded by DCGEF, which totaled \$105,000 in 2022, is possible not only from investing wisely, but also from the generosity of the wonderful people and businesses in these two communities.

In 2022, the fifth annual Raising Education Dollars (RED) Dinner and Auction was an extremely successful event! The foundation has been able to increase the number of four-year renewable scholarships to three! This was a goal for the foundation board and we were able to achieve that goal because of the generosity of the attendees at the event. All recipients of the RED scholarship remain in school even though the dropout rate due to financial burden among college freshmen is 50%.

Thank you to all those who attended RED or donated to the event to make these scholarships possible!

Not only does DCGEF work to raise money, we also serve to promote and administer business and individual scholarship donations. In 2022, we had thirty-six different scholarships that provided \$52,650 to DCG graduates and alumni. I am very appreciative to the business community for their continued support.

My family and I have been relocated to western Nebraska for my job. In 2023 I stepped down from my position as president of the board. Tiffany Hamil, the former Vice President of the board, will be taking over my position. The foundation will continue to be in great hands with the amazing board members who I have been privileged to work together with to meet our mission. I have been so humbled to be a part of such an organization making such a big difference! It is more important than ever to help students in our communities meet their educational goals to aid them in making a difference in their own lives, as well as the future of our country and our world. The cost of education continues to rise and the need from these students is even greater than ever.

Thank you to the board members, committee members, DCG staff, businesses, and individuals that have contributed in a variety of ways to DCGEF. 





